









Electronic Cigarettes in a Pod

Philip Morris' iQOS






Percentage of U.S. High School Students Who Currently Smoked Cigarettes,* 1991-2019[†]


Percentage of U.S. High School Students Who Currently Used an Electronic Vapor Product,* 2015-2019[†]


Percentage of U.S. High School Students Who Tried to Quit Using All Tobacco Products,* 2017-2019[†]






Missouri High School Student Tobacco Trends




MO Adult Tobacco Use – BRFSS 2018



Missouri Youth and Tobacco, 2017 Percentage of students who live with someone that smokes tobacco products, by student smoking status










