Coordinated School Health Scholarship

Sandy Nichols Mazzocco was a staunch proponent of Coordinated School Health Programs and the eight component framework model. As a memorial to her dedication to children, the coalition established a conference scholarship. The scholarship includes registration and lodging to the annual Missouri Coordinated School Health Conference. Individuals can apply for this scholarship award by completing the application.

Sandy served as a school nurse beginning in 1970 and became the first Coordinator of Health Services for Columbia Public Schools in 1979. Sandy was a passionate and consummate advocate for children, school nurses, and health education throughout her life. She also gave much of her heart and energy to the Missouri Association of School Nurses throughout her career.

After twenty years with Columbia Public Schools, Sandy became the Health and Physical Education Consultant for the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education in 1990. During her ten years at DESE, she was always in the forefront articulating the importance of health in the educational process of children and the contributions made by school nurses to promote and secure that goal. Her special interest in health education led her to be involved at the state and national level in initiating and promoting countless programs.

During her tenure as a state director in Missouri, Sandy initiated, developed and coordinated the annual Missouri Coordinated School Health Conference, Comprehensive School Health Summer Institute, and dozens of topic-specific knowledge and skills-building workshops presented throughout the state, training thousands of teachers and school nurses. She served as the co-organizer for the Governor's Comprehensive School Health Summit in 1994, and she was a driving force behind the development of the Missouri Comprehensive School Health Coalition.

Sandy's passion for improving children's health status and ability to achieve in school was often expressed through her work with and within organizations. She served important roles with the Governor's Council on Physical Fitness and Health, Missouri Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance, and Missouri Association of School Nurses at the state level, and the American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance, American School Health Association and SSDHPER at the national level.
