

Immunization Requirements for School Children

- All students must present documentation of up-to-date immunization status, including month, day and year of each immunization before attending school.
- The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) allows a 4-day grace period. Students in all grade levels may receive immunizations up to four days before the due date.



Immunization Requirements for School Children

- For children beginning kindergarten during or after the 2003-04 school year, required immunizations should be administered according to the current Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices Schedule, including all spacing, (<http://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/schedules/index.html>).

Immunization Requirements for School Children

➤ To remain in school, students "in progress" must have an Immunization In Progress form (Imm.P.14), which includes the appointment date for needed immunizations, on file and must receive immunizations as soon as they become due. The student is in compliance as long as he/she continues to receive the appropriate immunization(s) at the correct intervals according to the ACIP recommendations.

IMMUNIZATIONS IN PROGRESS

REQUIRED UNDER THE STATE IMMUNIZATION LAWS (SECTION 167.181 AND SECTION 210.003, RSMO) FOR SCHOOL, PRESCHOOL, DAY CARE AND NURSERY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE.

In the event of an outbreak or suspected outbreak of a vaccine-preventable disease within a particular facility, children who are not fully immunized or do not have documented laboratory evidence of immunity shall not be allowed to attend school or day care until the local health authority declares the designated outbreak or health emergency has ended.

CHILDREN IN PROGRESS

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Immunizations are the best protection against serious diseases. Vaccines are safe and effective and were developed to protect individuals from dangerous and sometimes deadly diseases.

Unfortunately, some children fall behind in getting their age-specific immunizations required for child care and school attendance.

According to Missouri regulation, children who have not received immunizations required for child care and school attendance cannot attend until their immunizations are up-to-date. However, a child is allowed to attend if the required immunization series has begun and an appointment for the next dose is scheduled. The immunization appointment must be documented on an in-progress card and filed with the child care facility or school.

The appointment must be kept and an updated immunization record must be provided to the child care facility or school. If the appointment is not kept, the child is no longer in progress and is non-compliant and cannot attend child care or school.

An in-progress exemption can be obtained from the local health department or a physician. The in-progress card must be signed by a physician, public health nurse or doctor and filed with the school administrator or child care facility.

Immunizations may save your child's life.

- Tdap
 - Required for grades 8-12.
 - If a student received a Tdap, the student is up-to-date. Tdap is currently licensed for one dose only; an additional dose is not needed.

MCV (Meningococcal) ⁴								1				2

- MCV (Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine)
 - Grade 8: One dose of MCV is required.
 - Must be given at age 10 or older.
 - Grade 12: Two doses of MCV is required unless the first dose was administered to a student who was 16 years of age or older, in which case only one dose is required.

- MCV (Continued)
 - Immunization record must show dose of:
 - MCV
 - MCV4
 - MenACWY
 - Meningococcal conjugate
 - Menactra
 - Menveo

- **IPV**
 - **Kindergarten-6 Grade:** Last dose must be administered on or after the fourth birthday. The interval between the next-to-last and last dose should be at least six months.
 - **7-12 Grades:** Last dose on or after the fourth birthday. If all four doses are administered appropriately and received prior to the fourth birthday, an additional dose is **not** needed. Any combination of four doses of IPV and OPV by four-six years of age constitutes a complete series. **Maximum needed:** four doses.

- **MMR**
 - Two doses required for grades Kindergarten through 12.
 - First dose must be given on or after twelve months of age.
 - Dose one and two must be spaced at least 28 days apart.

- **Hepatitis B**
 - Three plus doses required for grades Kindergarten through 12.
 - To be considered valid the following must be met:
 - At least four weeks between dose one and two
 - At least 8 weeks between doses two and three
 - At least 16 weeks between doses one and three
 - Final dose must be at given at least 24 weeks of age.

Varicella ^a	2	2	2	2	2	2	2	1	1	1	1	1	No doses required. However, vaccination is highly recommended.

- Varicella
 - First dose must be given on or after twelve months of age.
 - Dose one and two must be spaced at least three months apart.
 - Kindergarten-6 Grade: As satisfactory evidence of disease, a licensed health care provider may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the month and year of previous varicella (chickenpox) disease.

- Varicella (continued)
 - 7-11 Grades: As satisfactory evidence of disease, a parent/guardian or MD or DO may sign and place on file with the school a written statement documenting the month and year of previous varicella (chickenpox) disease.

Immunization Requirements for School Children 19 CSR 20-28.010

- It is unlawful for any student to attend school unless the student has been immunized according to this rule or unless a signed statement of medical or religious exemption is **on file** with the school administrator.
- Satisfactory evidence of immunization means a statement, certificate, or record from a physician or his or her designee, other recognized health facility, immunization registry, school record, or child care record stating that the required immunizations have been given to the person and verifying the type of vaccine.



**Immunization Requirements
for School Children
19 CSR 20-28.010**

- Students of Military Families
 - Under section 160.2000, RSMo, children of military families shall be given thirty (30) days from the date of enrollment to obtain any required immunization, or initial vaccination for a required series of immunizations.



**Immunization Requirements
for School Children
19 CSR 20-28.010**

- Homeless Students
 - A student determined to be homeless by school officials may be enrolled in school for no more than thirty (30) days. If the homeless student's immunization record is not obtained within the thirty (30) days and the student is still eligible for services under the homeless education program, the student must begin the immunization series and demonstrate that satisfactory progress has been accomplished within ninety (90) days.



**Immunization Requirements
for School Children
19 CSR 20-28.010**

- Alien Students
 - Individual who is not a US citizen or US national. These include:
 - International adoptions;
 - Immigrants;
 - Refugees;
 - Student visas; or
 - Illegal immigrants.
 - Students with alien classification **must** comply with the Missouri immunization requirements for school attendance.



Immunization Requirements for School Children 19 CSR 20-28.010

- As mandated by section 167.181, RSMo, each superintendent of a public, private, parochial or parish school shall have a record prepared showing the immunization status of **every** child enrolled in or attending a school under the superintendent's jurisdiction.
- Summary Report is due October 15 of each school year.



Summary Report Immunization Status of Schools

On-line

- If the school submitted the report on-line last year, the **same** user name and password is active each year.
- To submit the report on-line for the **first time**, send an e-mail to SchoolImmunizationReporting@health.mo.gov requesting a user name and password. The school will receive reporting instructions with a user name and password within five business days.



Summary Report Immunization Status of Schools

- Return the Summary Report Packet Request form, or
- Send an e-mail to SchoolImmunizationReporting@health.mo.gov requesting the summary report packet be mailed to the school, or
- Download and print the summary report packet at health.mo.gov/living/wellness/immunizations, select School Requirements.




ShowMeVax
