





## Education Starts at Home

- Remember: there is no such thing as CHILD-PROOF
- Store all household products, medications, and poisons up and away and out of reach from children.
- Follow all label precautions.
- Do not transfer products to unmarked containers or beverage bottles all too often, this leads to somebody accidentally swallowing it.
- Take your own medicine where children can't watch. They learn by imitating you.
- Keep the poison center number near every phone and program the Poison Help phone number (1-800-222-1222) in every cell phone.



- 1. Stay away from areas at home that could contain poisonous items.
- 2. Never touch, taste, or smell something that could be poisonous, especially if you don't know what it is.
- 3. If you don't know what it is stay away and ask a grown-up.
- 4. Tell a grown-up if you see something that could be dangerous.
- 5. If someone you know touches, tastes, or smells something that could be poisonous, tell a grown-up right away.



- Poisons can be cleaners or other products adults use in the house, yard or garage.

- Poisons can be things you might find underneath a <u>sink</u> or cabinet.
- If you think it might be poison, Stay Away!
- If someone may have been poisoned, call the poison center right away.
- Nurses, pharmacists and doctors work at the poison center.
- Lock poisons up.
- Keep them out of sight and out of <u>reach</u>.
- Mom and Dad should always read labels before giving medicine or using household products

#### POISON PREVENTION TEACHING PROGRAM

#### THE LESSON WILL HELP STUDENTS:

- 1. Understand what a poison is.
- 2. Know the different forms of poison such as liquids, solids, gases and sprays.
- 3. Identify things in and around the home that could be poisonous.
- 4. Learn how to stay safe from poisons at home and at school.
- 5. Know the importance of the toll-free number for Poison Help.

The Missouri Poison Center welcomes teachers, child care providers, scout leaders, EMS providers, and other community members to use this lesson to teach children about poison safety. It can be taught at any time of the year. We want to support teachers with resources when they teach topics including, but not limited to:

#### POISON INFORMATION

Educating children about poisons is not always easy because poisons that can hurt children may be products that we use every day.

#### A. ASK "WHO CAN TELL ME WHAT A POISON IS?"

- A poison is something that if you eat, smell, taste, or touch, can make you sick or hurt you, or even kill you. Poisons can be found inside and outside. Always ask a grown-up first before you eat or drink something new. If you don't know what it is, stay away! Poisons can be things we see or use every day.
- 2. Poison may come in a pretty box, jar or bottle.
- 3. Poison may smell and taste good.
- Sometimes poisons can be things we see or use every day in our homes, and even at school. Poisons can be:

Cleaners, chemicals or other products in the house or yard Medicines - if too much is taken Medicines - if it is taken by the wrong person Things you might find in your parent's or grandparent's medicine cabinet Things you might find underneath a sink or cabinet

### What about Tweens?

- Kids are starting to self-medicate as early as 11 years old.
- Over 20,000 kids per year need medical help due to medicine mistakes or misuse.

 Only 54% of tweens know over-the-counter (OTC) be dangerous when misused



Images of Brain Development in Healthy Children and Teens (ages 5–20)










Health Information Sources for Teens

- 3.Be sure to get the facts correct






# What do Teens Want? (continued)


